# Tanah Makmur, Cenergi to build biogas plant

**PETALING JAYA:** Tanah Makmur Bhd's wholly owned subsidiary Sri Jelutung Palm Oil Mill Sdn Bhd has entered into a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with Cenergi SEA Sdn Bhd's wholly owned subsidiary Metro Havana Sdn Bhd to build a biogas plant.

The biogas plant will be adjacent to the existing palm oil mill plant at Sri Jelutung in Pekan, Pahang, which is being upgraded from 30mt/hr to 45mt/hr.

In a filing with Bursa Malaysia yesterday, Tanah Makmur said the biogas plant is in line with a new regulation imposed by the Malaysian Palm Oil Mill Board whereby any upgrading of an existing palm oil mill requires the company to obtain a biogas plant to mitigate the green house gases effect, which will especially capture methane gas from the effluent pond.

"Cenergi SEA (a wholly owned subsidiary company of Khazanah Nasional Bhd) has a track record of running biogas plant. The methane gas collected from the effluent pond will be the fuel to generate electricity. The said plant will generate 1.5 Mw per hour of electricity which will be sold to Tenaga Nasional Bhd under Sustainable Energy Development Authority (SEDA) Fit-in-Tariff," it added.
